ASSESSMENT POLICY

- Assessment tasks that have not been completed to the best of a student's ability (e.g. Untidy presentation, no indication of proof-reading / poor spelling or grammar, illegible writing) will be returned for rectification and submission the next school-day, with loss of 5% of allocated marks (rounded up to nearest whole mark)
- At the time an assessment task is assigned, a DUE DATE will be notified.
- Failure to complete or submit the assessment task on the due date *without reasonable cause* will incur:

- Late 1 school-day: *Loss of 10% of allocated marks (rounded up)*
 - Late 2 school-days: *Loss of 20% of allocated marks (rounded up)*
 - Late 3 school-days: *The work will not be accepted and parents notified (E-mail or 'phone)*
4. When a student is absent on the day an "in-class" assessment task is administered, s/he will be:

 - b. deemed to have not completed the assessment *if the absence is unauthorised* (i.e. a 'U' or 'V' code is entered for the day in the College's absentee records), with a mark of 0 awarded for that assessment
